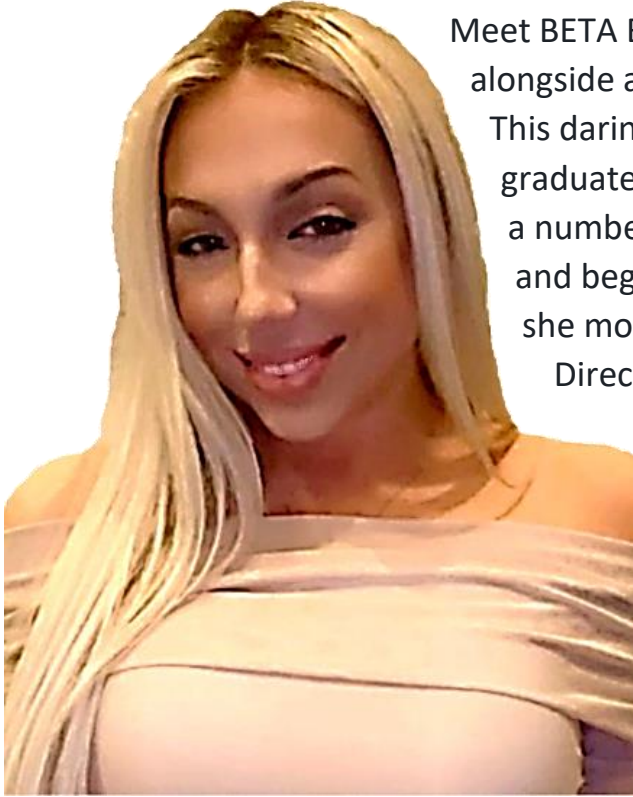

### **Q. Anything new happening in Bell Tower Park?**

**A.** Going to try a “Git-‘er-Done” Group. Not associated with any Bell Tower Park management or committees, it will be a group of individuals who want to help residents with any maintenance or repair problem they might be having with their unit. The group will either (1) solve the problem; (2) help the individual complete a Work Order and follow up on the results; or (3) get a quotation from a licensed-insured handyman for them.

As of now, it is proposed that the group will meet the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Tuesdays of each month from 9:00 a.m. until 11:00 a.m. starting with the first meeting on February 27, 2024. A phone number will be provided for those who cannot make the meetings at the clubhouse. Also, if you know of any handymen who would like the group to contact them for quotes, we need those names also.

### **Q. How fast is Fort Myers growing?**

**A.** Really fast. It is said that Lee County will have over 1 million residents within 6 more years. One of the fastest areas is the so-called Alico corridor. What was barely a road back in the 1980’s is now becoming a corridor of economic boom. According to *Gulfshore Business* magazine, one out of every three jobs in Lee County, and one in four in Southwest Florida, will be in the Alico corridor—roughly defined as the space bordered by the airport to the north, Alico Road to the south, Treeline Avenue to the east and US 41 to the west.

Many companies are moving north to be closer to their workforce. Lee County drivers have some of the longest commutes in the state, 45 miles each way for some. Extending Alico to SR 82 by the end of the decade should help cut commute times for people driving from Lehigh, making companies located along Alico even more attractive. “We’ve hit a population level now where it’s becoming impossible to service our community from Tampa, Miami or Orlando anymore. Companies must be in the community to serve you.”

Today, buildings are being leased and sold as fast as they are being built. There are more than 25 projects under development in the Corridor presently, including Alico Crossing, Alico Medical Center, Three Oaks Distribution Center, Home Depot, ITEC Park and others. There are over 30 businesses already located in the Corridor, including Amazon, Wayfair, Arthrex, Clive Daniels, Robb & Stuckey, NeoGenomics, Frantz Eyecare, and California Closets to name a few. Gulf Coast Town Center, hotels, big-box stores, restaurants, gas station, fast food and other smaller retail businesses are beginning to front the road. And this might be just the beginning!!

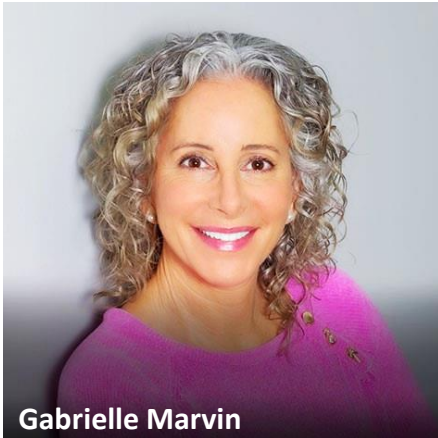

## Communications Committee Report

### New Website on the Horizon? Maybe.

The POA Board and a crowd of about 20 residents convened on January 30<sup>th</sup> to learn how a supplemental website might improve the flow of information in our community. Gabrielle Marvin, Founder and President of RGB Internet Systems of Naples was the presenter. Her company has 23 years of experience in the design of websites and is now concentrating on its growing service to HOAs and Condo Associations like ours. After a 30-minute interactive demonstration, Ms. Marvin answered questions from the Board and the audience.

It was stressed that this approach, if the Board decides to go ahead, would not necessarily mean the end of our current website (FrontSteps). FrontSteps would continue to meet certain management and financial functions required by law. As a companion platform, the RGB product would offer better user-friendly viewing and input of the more social aspects of Bell Tower Park. Content such as activity reports, events, calendars, business/restaurant reviews, personalities, photo galleries of amenities, online forms, Board/Committee info, etc. A major goal would be the re-establishment of a combined Resident Directory, including only owners who agree to be listed. The directory would be searchable to the point of finding that owner whose dog is named “Bowser”, but you don’t remember the owner’s name! Active links to external info such as utilities, county agencies, news and weather will be readily available and easy to find.

The domain, structure and content of the website would be the property of Bell Tower Park and would therefore be unaffected by any changes in management. An example of pricing for RGB’s entry level service was outlined. One of several set-up scenarios would require an initial deposit of \$700, followed by 10 monthly payments of \$230 – a total of \$3,000. Continued maintenance after that would be \$75/month, which is based on a certain volume of updating. No long-term contracts are involved, so the agreement can be terminated at any time, with BTP retaining control of the site.

At the end of the meeting, the Board voted unanimously for the CommComm to solicit a quote from RGB, to be considered at the Board’s Feb. 26<sup>th</sup> meeting. If the quote is accepted, the initial new website might be operating by June. Updates will be sent on any progress.

## More Ways to Access the BTP Website (FrontSteps)

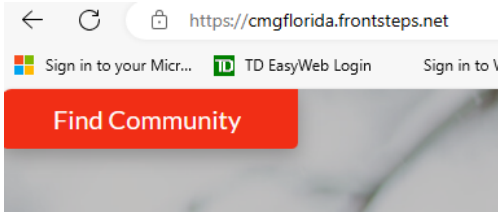

Cardinal Management hosts the Bell Tower Park Website. It contains a wealth of information such as a calendar of events, Directory of Residents (for those who chose to add their information), financial documents, meeting minutes, newsletters, etc. We strongly encourage you to register for access to the Website at your earliest convenience.

Once you've registered for the Website, we recommend you click on the  **Newsletters** folder to read all the latest newsletters. Also under the Newsletters folder is a **Helpful to Know** document. It contains a variety of information that you will find extremely helpful as a new resident (ex. Management office contact information, utilities information, gate codes, committee information, etc.)

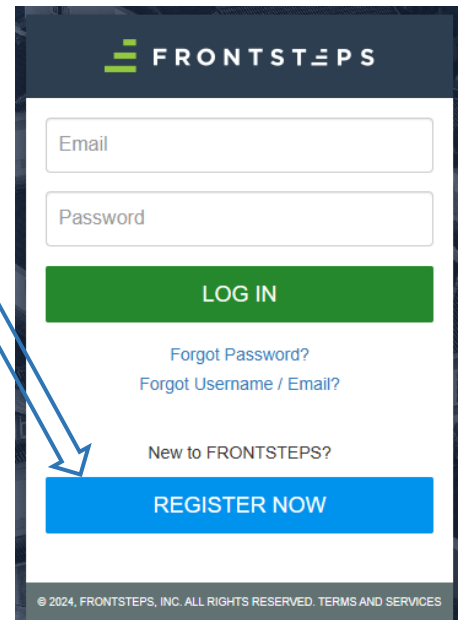

**SAFETY COMMITTEE**

In this busy world of work, visiting guests, respiratory viruses and other uncertainties we often neglect our collective well-being by overlooking the truism of, “Safety is everyone’s responsibility”. Your Bell Tower Safety Committee wishes to remind all residents to take the necessary steps to ensure their personal safety along with that of others.

Please remember to observe the parking rules and regulations which have been developed for all residents. Vehicle parking overnight in the designated GUEST parking is reserved for the parking of the vehicles of guests with the BTP parking pass affixed to the mirror or placed in a visible location on the dashboard. BTP parking passes may be obtained from the BTP Office. All residents are reminded that, in accordance with adopted BTP rules and regulations, their vehicles must be parked overnight in either their driveway or garage. No overnight parking is allowed on the street or grass.

The presentation by the Lee County Sheriff’s Office on October 18, 2023 focused on, “Frauds, Scams and Identity Theft” during which BTP attendees were alerted to these rapidly-spreading illegal acts. We have recently been alerted that one practice in particular is in widespread use.

Voice appropriation or voice cloning scams use Artificial Intelligence (AI) to mimic voices of people you might know to exploit the listener. This frequently occurs with older members of the public who may believe that they are speaking with a grandchild or other family members. One method of protection is to ask for a pre-arranged family code word prior to engaging in conversation with the caller. Additional information may be obtained from the Lee County Sheriff's Office.

Lastly, please remember to honor the established speed limits within the community, as the mantle of community safety rests upon the shoulders of each and every one of us. 🏰

We are fortunate to have so many great restaurants within walking distance of Bell Tower Park. One of my favorites is BURNTWOOD TAVERN located in Bell Tower Shops at the intersection of Route 41 and Daniels Parkway. They offer a great menu, wonderful



outdoor seating, and fun, friendly bartenders and staff. Some of my favorite appetizers include Firecracker Shrimp, Sticky Pork Wings, Angus Beef Sliders, and Buffalo Chicken Flatbread. One of their killer entrees is the Crispy Chicken Sandwich tossed in honey hot sauce topping with crispy coleslaw and dill pickles. Additional entrees include Cedar-Planked Salmon, Rasta Pasta, Chicken Milanese and Street Tacos all served with Parmesan Truffle Fries. 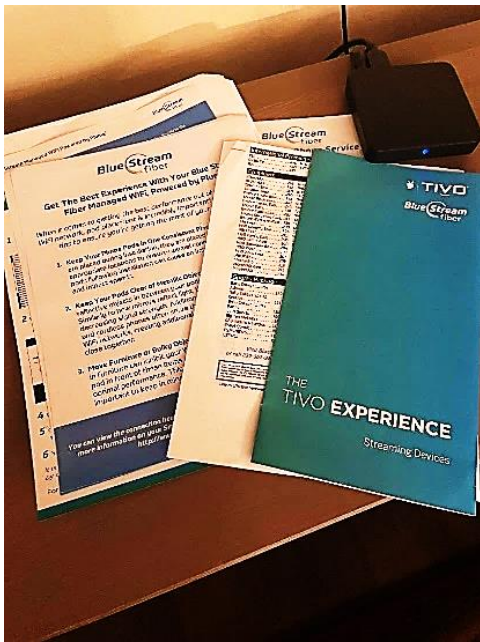
