## Reflections and Future Plans

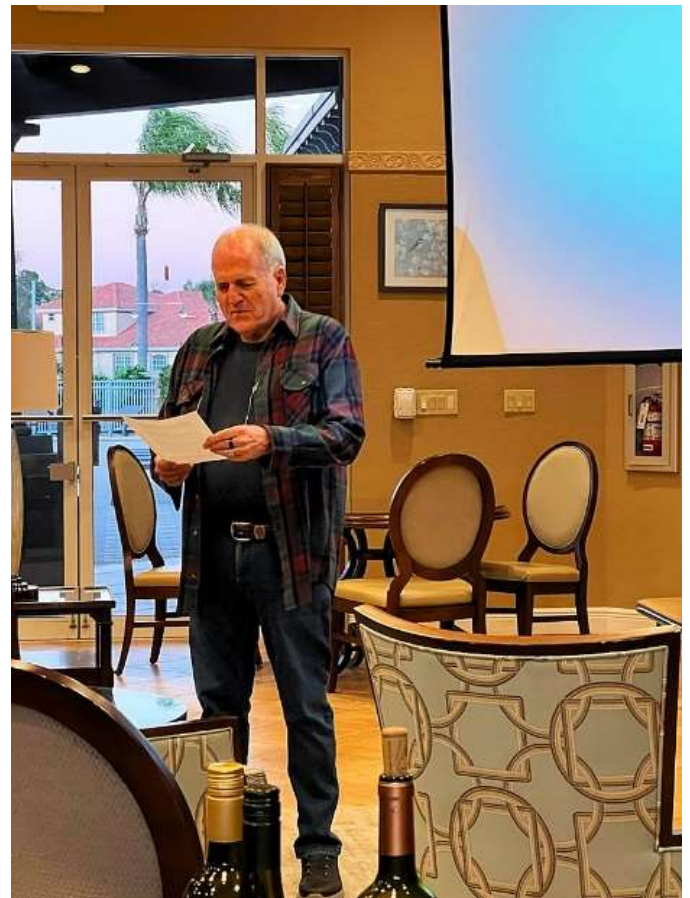
As the credits rolled and the evening drew to a close, the sense of satisfaction and happiness was evident on
